Hughes Center to Launch Health Center

The Health Foundation of Greater Cincinnati gave a two-year, \$200,000 grant to Hughes Center to develop and open a school-based health center. The center initially will offer primary medical care to Hughes Center's students. School administrators hope to expand the center to include dental services. It will operate on the Hughes campus and will be staffed by a physician's assistant and an administrative assistant.

Renowned Artist to Share Entrepreneurial Savvy with Woodward Students

Students in Woodward Career Technical High School's Entrepreneur Academy will learn how to be successful in business from Gilbert Young, a world-renowned artist and graduate of Cincinnati Public Schools. Mr. Young is back in Cincinnati to showcase his new artwork, *History + Hope = Change*, a portrait of President-Elect Barack Obama that will feature both Young's and Obama's signatures. Mr. Young is best known for his celebrated *He Ain't Heavy* masterpiece, which he created during the 1970s. Mr. Young's artwork also will be featured at The Frank White Gallery located at Jordan Crossing (7030 Reading Road) in suite 304 from 1:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. on Saturday, December 13, 2008.
